Rosmina Rhandera is a British Citizen. She came to the UK in 1982 from Malawi. As a result of the 1981 Nationality Act, she is now classified as a 'British Overseas Citizen'. The Home Office are using this classification to deport her husband, Azhar and to break up her family. Rosmina was widowed at the age of 19 years. This is her second marriage and now her second chance of happiness is threatened. The Home Office classify Rosmina as a Second Class citizen thus denying her and her children a fundamental human right to family life.

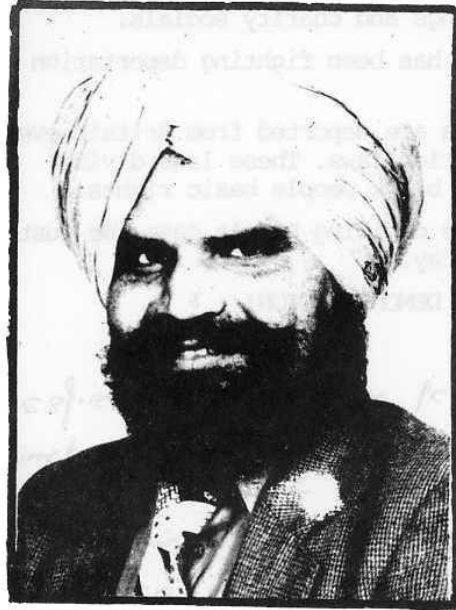
The Home Office claim they take compassionate circumstances into account. However Rosmina and Azhar's situation shows what this means in practice.

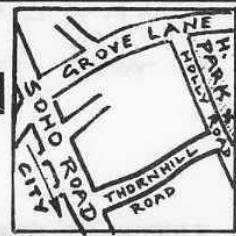

BLOOD TEST RESULTS – POSITIVE HOME OFFICE RESPONSE – NEGATIVE

The probability that the 38 DNA fingerprint bands of Salema Begum can all be matched by chance with bands in Mr. Gura Miah's and Mrs. Azizun Nessa's DNA fingerprints is more than 390 thousand million to one against.

On the 9th of January the results of the blood tests were finally received. Salema's family had to pay £500 to be told something they already knew- that Salema IS her parents daughter.

Salema came out of sanctuary when her safety was guaranteed.

Salema has been living under the threat of Temporary Admission Orders. This one runs out on the 1st March 1988. A Temporary Admission Order can be revoked at any time and only increases the family's insecurity.

The Home Office is using delaying tactics. Present is essential now

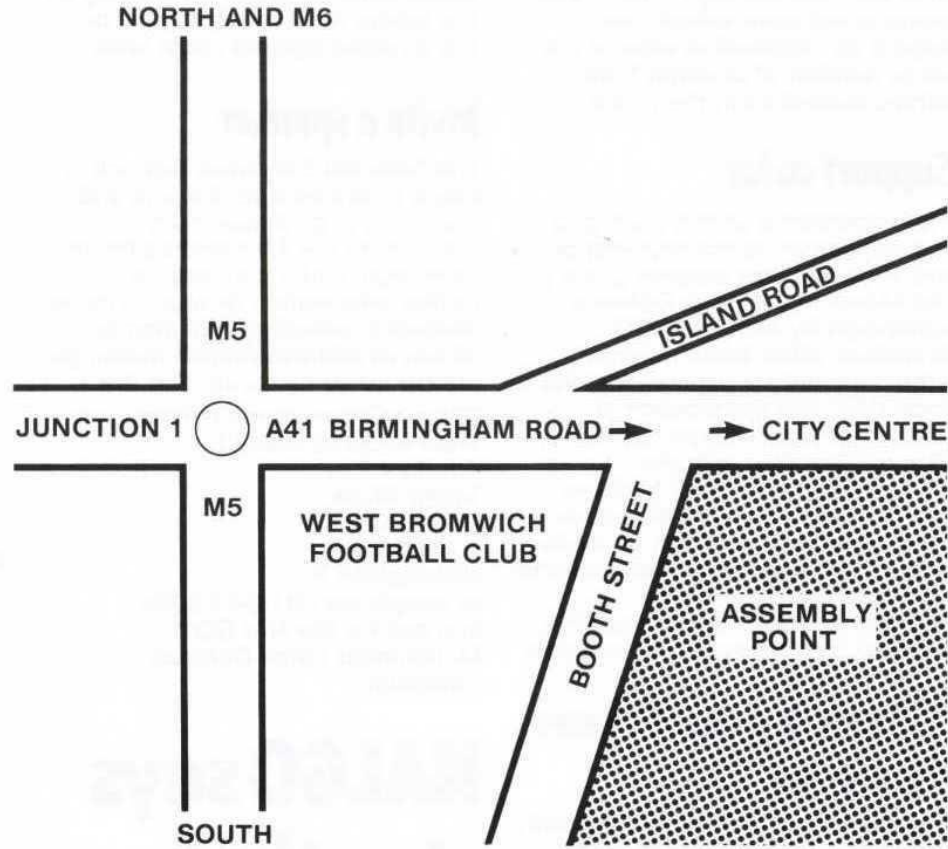

STOP THE CRIMINALISATION AND DEPORTATION OF BLACK YOUTH!

Karamjit Singh and four other youths were imprisoned for arson during the uprisings of 1981. They had petrol bombed clubs that operated colour bars. At no time did the courts consider the possibility of applying sanctions with regard to the immigration status of the youths involved. Racist immigration officers initiated their own actions and became police, judge and jury in Karamjit's case. On the one hand the racist police increase the criminalisation of black youth in particular. On the other, racist immigration laws aim to deport black people for not being "conducive to the public good". The implications for black people are clear, full scale deportations will continue and increasingly involve more and more black people, until the racist governments of Britain meet the standards set by the National Front.

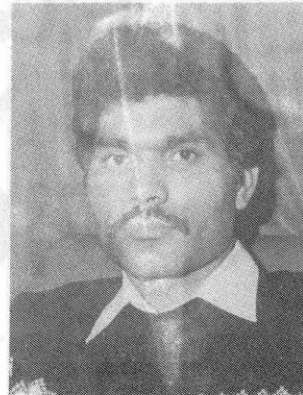




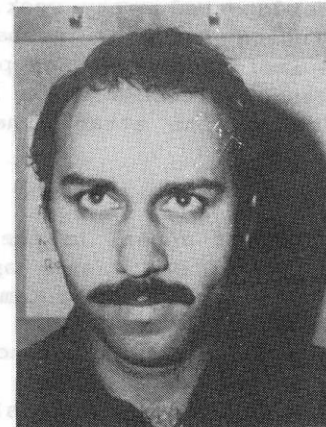
NIGAT BUTT, who has lived here for 20 years and became a British citizen 10 years ago, met and engaged Tariq Mahmood in 1979. The Home Office have continually refused Tariq entry from Pakistan claiming that his 'primary intent' in coming here is not his marriage to Nigat.



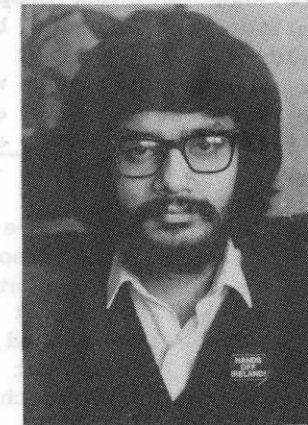
MANZURA BIBI was born in the UK and has lived here all her life. On a visit to Pakistan in 1982 she met Abdullah Shah, a marriage was arranged and Abdullah applied to come to the UK. After interviewing both Manzura and Abdullah, in separate countries, a year later the Home Office refused his application, saying his 'primary intent' in coming here was not marriage.



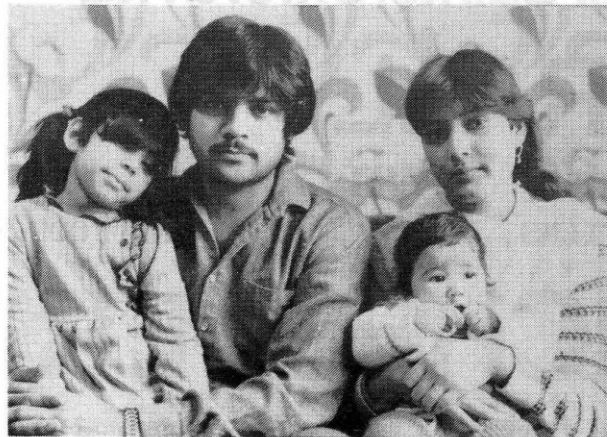
KAMAL KUMAR is now under very serious threat of deportation, because his marriage broke down, even though the rules say he should be allowed to stay. In January, the Court of Appeal turned down his application for judicial review of his case.



MASOOM ALI SHAH came here last August to study computing. Even though he had a letter confirming his college place and proof of financial support, immigration officials ruled he was not a 'genuine student' and would 'probably abscond' at the end of his course. He has no right of appeal against the attempt to deport him.

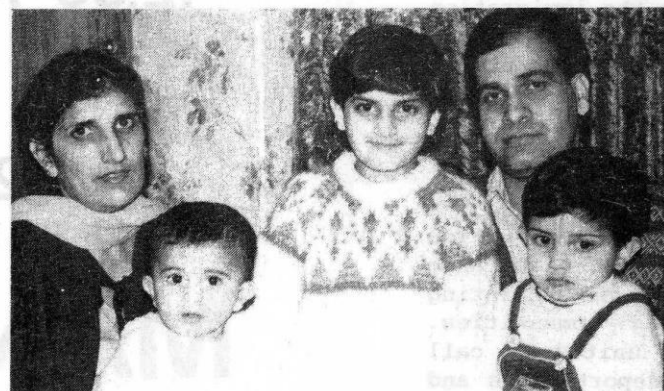


VIRAJ MENDIS, a supporter of 'Fight Racism! Fight Imperialism!', had his passport confiscated by the police last June. He has lived here for 11 years but now the Home Office want to deport him to Sri Lanka, where he faces almost certain imprisonment for his support for the oppressed Tamil people.

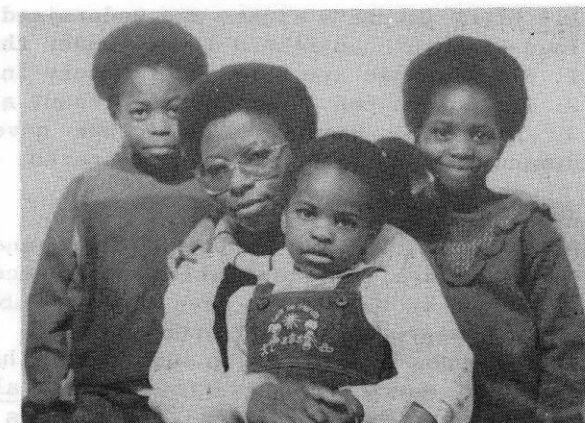


ROSMINA BANU RANDERA and MOHAMMED AZHAR

Rosmina came here in 1982 from Tanzania and was granted residency. Mohammed came here in 1982 on a visit. The couple met, married in 1983 and have had a child. Now the Home Office want to deport him because Rosmina, though she holds a British passport, is a second-class, 'British Overseas' citizen as a result of the Nationality Act.



The ASLAM FAMILY are threatened with deportation even though Mr Aslam came here in 1973, Mrs Aslam arrived in 1974 and all their three children, aged 6, 2 and 10 months were born here. Both of Mrs Aslam's elderly parents, who are permanent residents here, are seriously ill and heavily dependent on her.



MANDA KUNDA fled from her husband because of the extreme violence and cruelty he has been inflicting on her and her three children for years. She is threatened with deportation and if she is forced to return to Zambia she would find herself without support and in great danger. Her children would pass into the hands of her husband's mother.
